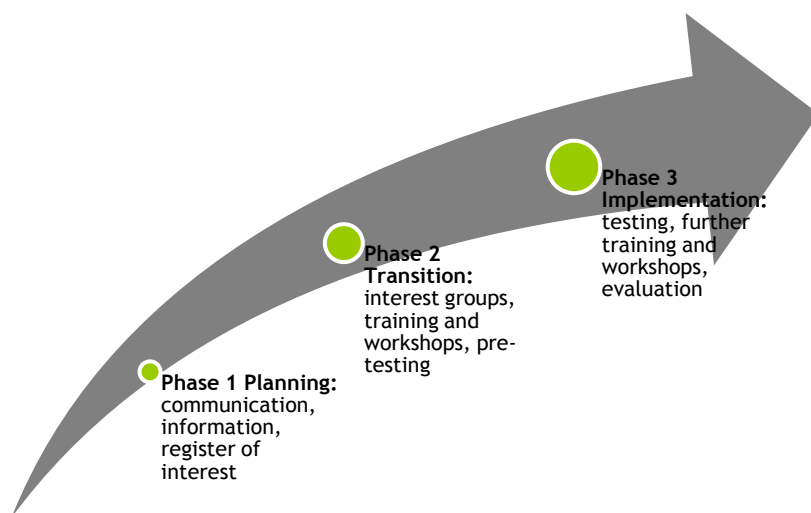
INTRODUCTION

Welcome everyone to one of the biggest changes in our sport in many decades. Over the next 12 months we will be helping you all to take the steps needed to ensure New Zealand joins with the rest of the international skating community in this move.

World Skate has developed a judging system with defined standards and assessment criteria. The system has been developed and tested in parts of Europe and the US. World Skate expect all federated countries world-wide to progressively transition towards implementing and using this scoring system.

The authority responsible for the system is the NZFRS Artistic Committee. They have appointed an implementation group; the RollArt Steering Sub-Committee to assist them to facilitate the adoption of the RollArt scoring system throughout New Zealand. We are working on a plan to allow for a successful transition to prepare the skating community to adopt the RollArt scoring system for all competitions effective from July 2019.

RollArt will impact everyone and it is an exciting positive change; but communicating information and managing expectations highlight the importance that everyone needs to become a part of the conversation.



Phase 1 - is happening now

Phase 2 - will most likely start in October and continue into 2019

Phase 3 - will start towards the end of 2018 and beginning of 2019
