

N . Z . F . R . S Special Awards

Purpose:

To provide guidelines for the selection of recipients of these awards at the New Zealand Speed Championships.

Dick Mahon Cup - Primary Female Aggregate

Awarded to the Primary speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Colville Trophy - Primary Male Aggregate

Awarded to the Primary speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Dick Mahon Cup - Juvenile Female Aggregate

Awarded to the Juvenile speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Begg Trophy - Juvenile Male Aggregate

Awarded to the Juvenile speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Barcelona Cup - Cadet Female Aggregate

Awarded to the Cadet Female Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships at the NZ Speed Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Tokoroa Cup - Cadet Male Aggregate

Awarded to the Cadet Male Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships at the NZ Speed Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Simmons Memorial - Junior Ladies Aggregate

Awarded to the Junior speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Mt Wellington Roller Sports Club Trophy - Junior Men Aggregate

Awarded to the Junior speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Friendship Cup – Senior Female Aggregate

Awarded to the Senior Female Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

JKS Cup Men's Aggregate –Senior Male Aggregate

Awarded to the Senior Male Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

N . Z . F . R . S Special Awards

Robert Stack Cup - Masters Female Aggregate

Awarded to the Masters Female Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Robert Stack Cup - Masters Male Aggregate

Awarded to the Masters Male Speed skater with the highest aggregate points in both the New Zealand Road and Flat Track Championships. The aggregate is calculated as dictated in the Speed rules for New Zealand Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Wanganui Speed Award

Awarded to an individual for the services, commitment and dedication to the sport of Speed Skating during the past year. Nominations in writing are called for before the Speed Committee AGM and club delegates at that AGM vote from nominations received. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Joe Bright Memorial Trophy Male – Speed

Awarded for an outstanding performance at the New Zealand Championships by a male speed skater. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Joe Bright Memorial Trophy Female - Speed

Awarded for an outstanding performance at the New Zealand Championships by a female speed skater. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Speed Committee.

Rotorua Trophy

Awarded to the best dressed team on the floor at the opening ceremony at the New Zealand Championships. It is usual that a visiting dignitary be the chief judge, assisted by a member of the Federation. The award should be awarded for uniformity, colour and design of team skating costumes. The award is the responsibility of the President of the Board and is made during the opening ceremony.

Whittle Cup

Awarded to the youngest competing skater at the New Zealand Championships. The Event Manager and Trophy Steward are responsible for this award.

Volunteer of the Year Trophy

The Volunteer of the Year award will be awarded annually at the New Zealand Championships. The Board will select a Volunteer of the Year from nominations received. The following criteria must be applied:

- Nominees must be a current financial member of the NZFRS.
- Nominees must be volunteers, i.e. not receive payment for any activity in relation to roller sports
- Nominations can come from clubs but must be signed by a proposer and a seconder
- Nominations must be in the hands of the NZFRS Secretary at or before the Team Managers meeting
- The award will be presented at the New Zealand Championships Closing Ceremony

Unity Trophy

Awarded to the club gaining the most points in all speed events at the New Zealand Championships. Points are calculated from flat track, road and relays. Points should be awarded as follows: 1st placing – 4 points, 2nd placing – 2 points, 3rd placing – 1 point. This award is the responsibility of the Speed Committee.

Skating Oscar

Awarded for the most outstanding performance(s) at the New Zealand Championships by a male or female skater. Every skater at the New Zealand Championships is eligible for the award. These are prestigious awards made by the NZFRS Board from written nominations received from registered officials including Team Managers. The nominations should be handed to the Event Manager in the time frame set by the Event Manager and advised at the Team Managers Meeting. NZFRS Policy number 1.10b should also be read.

N . Z . F . R . S Special Awards

PURPOSE:

To provide guidelines for the selection of recipients of these awards at the New Zealand Artistic Championships.

Italian Trophy

Awarded each year to the highest placed New Zealand Artistic skater or team who has placed in the top 50% of their event at the Senior World Championships. This award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee.

Avis Berry Trophy

Awarded to the Senior Lady who has gained the most points in Figures, Free skating and Solo Dance in the senior grade at the New Zealand Artistic Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee and is calculated by the Chief Calculator.

Ian Mackie Memorial Trophy

Awarded to the Junior Lady who has gained the most points in Figures, Free skating and Solo Dance in the junior grade at the New Zealand Artistic Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee and is calculated by the Chief Calculator.

Jack Fanthorpe Memorial Fund

Awarded to the Artistic skater who has achieved the most in National and International fields, having a sense of commitment to the sport of skating. The award is made at New Zealand Championships. The criteria for this award is as follows:

Points are accumulative over a skating year and will be awarded for placements in the following competitions:

- Senior events at New Zealand Artistic Championships
- Oceania Championships
- Graeme Sheppard Challenge
- World Senior Artistic Championships

Points allocation; 1st place - 3 points, 2nd place - 2 points, 3rd place - 1 point. Note: if only one skater or pair is competing in an event then the points allocated will be halved. In the event of a tie then the trophy is awarded jointly. This award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee and is calculated by the Chief Calculator.

Jack Fanthorpe Award

Awarded for the best performance by an artistic skater/s up to and including Cadet level. The selection of this skater/s will be done by will be done by Mrs Vilma Fanthorpe in conjunction with the Senior Judge at the New Zealand Artistic Championships.

Joe Bright Memorial Aggregate Trophy For Precision

Awarded to the club gaining the highest total points on actual event skating placements during the New Zealand Artistic Championships. Points should be awarded as follows: 1st placing – 4 points, 2nd placing – 2 points, 3rd placing – 1 point. This award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee.

Joe Bright Memorial Trophy Trainers Challenge Oscar (Artistic)

Awarded to the coach gaining the most points in all artistic events at the NZ Artistic Championships. The total is based on the combined placing of each coaches' skaters. The calculations are done by the NZ Artistic Committee. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee. See Artistic Policy 01.

Joe Bright Memorial Incentive Trophy for Services to Precision

Awarded to an individual that has been nominated for their 'Services, commitment and dedication to the sport of Precision, Show or Quartet Skating during the past year'. Nominations will be called for at the end of the year and the clubs vote via their delegates at the Artistic AGM at the NZ Artistic Championships. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee.

N . Z . F . R . S Special Awards

DC Sportsmanship Award

The true meaning of sportsmanship is behaving ethically towards others, being fair and reasonable to opponents and humble when competing. This new award is to celebrate a skater who has shown these qualities in the sport of artistic roller skating. The emphasis is not placed on the skaters personal skating ability but instead the sportsmanship shown towards their own skating, other skaters and officials. The award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee. See Artistic Policy 01.

Rotorua Trophy

Awarded to the best dressed team on the floor at the opening ceremony at the NZ Artistic Championship. It is usual that a visiting dignitary be the chief judge, assisted by a member of the Federation. The award should be awarded for uniformity, colour and design of team skating costumes. The award is the responsibility of the President of the Board and is made during the opening ceremony.

Whittle Cup

Awarded to the youngest competing skater at the New Zealand Championships. The Event Manager and Trophy Steward are responsible for this award.

Volunteer of the Year Trophy

The Volunteer of the Year award will be awarded Annually at the NZ Artistic Championships. The Board will select a Volunteer of the Year from nominations received. The following criteria must be applied:

- Nominees must be a current financial member of the NZFRS.
- Nominees must be volunteers, i.e., not receive payment for any activity in relation to roller sports
- Nominations will come from clubs and must be signed by a proposer and a seconder
- Nominations must be in the hands of the NZFRS Secretary at or before the Team Managers meeting
- The award will be presented at the NZ Artistic Championships Closing Ceremony

James (Jim) Taylor Memorial Trophy

Awarded for Club Development. For the club with the highest percentage increase of Artistic Federated Members over all classes of membership as at 30th June of the previous year and 30th June of this year. This is the responsibility of the NZFRS Board to calculate.

Artistic Competition Points Trophy (Charles Jacobsen Trophy)

Awarded to the club gaining the most points in all artistic events at the New Zealand Championships. Points should be awarded as follows: 1st placing – 4 points, 2nd placing – 2 points, 3rd placing – 1 point. This award is the responsibility of the NZ Artistic Committee

Skating Oscar

Awarded for the most outstanding performance(s) at the New Zealand Championships by an individual skater/s, dance / free-skating pairs, quartets, precision or show team. Every skater at the New Zealand Championships is eligible for the award. These are prestigious awards made by the NZFRS Championship Committee from written nominations received from registered officials including Team Managers. The nominations should be handed to the Event Manager in the time frame set and advised at the Team Managers meeting. NZFRS Policy number 1.10a should also be read.

Joe Bright Memorial Trophy (Artistic)

Awarded at Graeme Sheppard Challenge for the most outstanding performance by a skater or team. All grades at Graeme Sheppard Challenge are eligible for the award. The recommendation/s will come from the judging panel to the NZ Artistic Committee, who will make the final decision.
