30 March – 3 April 2018 Timaru, New Zealand

World Skate Oceania advises that the 2018 Oceania Speed Skating Championships will be hosted by the New Zealand Federation of Roller Sports [Skate NZ] in Timaru, New Zealand.

The event will be raced on a banked track using the agreed Banked Track Race Schedule.

The Championships are open to skaters from countries affiliated to World Skate. Federation sanctions from home federations will be required for international skaters.

Timaru:

Timaru is located on the east coast of the South Island of New Zealand. For international travelers, Christchurch is the nearest entry point into New Zealand.

Timaru is approximately 2 hours drive south of Christchurch.

South Canterbury Skating Club Banked Track. This is a 200 metre banked

track constructed to international standards.

- Both countries acknowledge that this change is outside the current Heads of Agreement.
- There is a corresponding change to the Senior grade where the age drops to 18 years and over as at December of the previous year.

Anti Doping Control:

Anti doping control will be carried out in accordance with World Skate Medical

Regulations.

An Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement and a Certificate of Successful Completion of an Education Programme must be completed and signed by all athletes and support personnel participating in Oceania Speed Championships.

Athletes under the age of 18 must have the form signed by a parent or guardian.

The Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement form is attached to this

invitation.

Also attached are necessary instructions to obtain a certificate of successful completion of an education programme provided by a NADO or WADA.

Both the Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement for doping control and the

certificate of education must be handed in at the Team Managers Meeting.

Competitors: Each Federation shall use its own method to select the team it enters for the

competition. Teams selected for competition at the Oceania Speed

Championships shall be the official Team of the country they are representing.

I acknowledge and agree that any dispute arising out of a decision made pursuant to the World Skate Anti-Doping Rules, after exhaustion of the process expressly provided for in the World Skate Anti-Doping Rules, may be appealed exclusively as provided in Article 13 of the World Skate Anti-Doping Rules to an appellate body for final and binding arbitration, which in the case of International-Level Athletes is the Court of Arbitration for Sport.
- 6. I acknowledge and agree that the decisions of the arbitral appellate body referenced above shall be final and enforceable, and that I will not bring any claim, arbitration, lawsuit or litigation in any other court or tribunal.

Doping Control – Requirements for Accreditation World Skate World Championships 2018 Competitive Year

Scope:

Athletes, coaches, doctors and medical staff, team managers and other support staff

All participants above must complete and provide

- Signed World Skate Acknowledgement and Agreement for Doping Control. The form must be signed by the participant and by a parent or guardian if the athlete is under 18 years old. Completed forms for each participant must handed in at the Team Managers meeting
- Certificate of completion of an anti-doping education programme. This programme
 may be provided by a National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) or the WADA elearning
 programme ALPHA. The certificate should be submitted to World Skate by Team
 Managers at the Team Managers meeting
- ALPHA is available on the WADA webpage www.wada-ama.org, click on what we do, education.
- Of the 10 possible anti doping rule violations only 1 depends on a positive test, 5 apply to athletes and 5 apply to athletes and others. You do not need to be tested to attract an anti-doping rule violation (adrv)
