## OCEANIA CONFEDERATION OF ROLLER SPORTS 2018 OCEANIA SPEED CHAMPIONSHIPS

30 March – 3 April 2018 Timaru, New Zealand

The Oceania Confederation of Roller Sports advises that the 2018 Oceania Speed Skating Championships will be hosted by the New Zealand Federation of Roller Sports [Skate NZ] in Timaru, New Zealand.

The event will be raced on a banked track using the agreed Banked Track Race Schedule.

The Championships are open to skaters from countries affiliated to World Skate. Federation sanctions from home federations will be required for international skaters.

Dates: 30 March – 3 April 2018  
Training days Thurs 29 and Fri 30 March  
Competition Sat 31 March and Sun 1 April  
Rest Day Monday 2 April  
Marathon Tuesday 3 April



Timaru: Timaru is located on the east coast of the South Island of New Zealand. For international travelers, Christchurch is the nearest entry point into New Zealand. Timaru is approximately 2 hours drive south of Christchurch.

Venue: **Racing:**  
South Canterbury Skating Club Banked Track. This is a 200 metre banked track constructed to international standards.

**Marathon:**  
Levels Raceway, Timaru

Officials: Federations are invited to nominate judges. Skate NZ regrets that it is unable to fund such officials.

Entry Fees: NZ \$130.00 per skater.

Race Schedule: The race schedule is attached as Attachment 1.

- Australia and New Zealand have agreed the change in ages and distances for Junior Skaters to comply with Youth Olympic Games requirements.
- Both countries acknowledge that this change is outside the current Heads of Agreement.
- There is a corresponding change to the Senior grade where the age drops to 18 years and over as at December of the previous year.

## Accommodation

- and Travel: Travel and Accommodation are the responsibility of participating skaters/officials and/or their respective National Federations.
- Trophies: Medals will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> places with all competitors/officials receiving a souvenir certificate of participation.
- Sanction: The championship will be conducted with sanctions from World Skate and Technical Commissions.
- Authorised Officials: Authorised Team Officials, for the supply of a free season pass, will constitute no more than one [1] team manager, one [1] assistant team manager, one [1] team coach and /or one [1] team doctor [medically qualified person eg doctor, physiotherapist] for speed.
- Closing Date: All entries close on **25 February 2018**.
- Nomination Forms: All entries must be provided by each Federation on the 'Entry Form's attached. These may be also downloaded from the Skate NZ website [www.skatenz.org.nz](http://www.skatenz.org.nz) or are available by emailing Skate NZ. [execoff@skatenz.org.nz](mailto:execoff@skatenz.org.nz)
- Anti Doping Control: Anti doping control will be carried out in accordance with World Skate Medical Regulations.
- An Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement and a Certificate of Successful Completion of an Education Programme must be completed and signed by all athletes and support personnel participating in Oceania Speed Championships.
- Athletes under the age of 18 must have the form signed by a parent or guardian.
- The Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement form is attached to this invitation.
- Also attached are necessary instructions to obtain a certificate of successful completion of an education programme provided by a NADO or WADA.
- Both the Antidoping & Acknowledgement Agreement for doping control and the certificate of education must be handed in at the Team Managers Meeting.
- Competitors: Each Federation shall use its own method to select the team it enters for the competition. Teams selected for competition at the Oceania Speed Championships shall be the official Team of the country they are representing.

**Doping Control – Requirements for Accreditation World Skate World Championships 2018  
Competitive Year**

**Scope:**

Athletes, coaches, doctors and medical staff, team managers and other support staff

**All participants above must complete and provide**

- Signed World Skate Acknowledgement and Agreement for Doping Control. The form must be signed by the participant and by a parent or guardian if the athlete is under 18 years old. Completed forms for each participant must be handed in at the Team Managers meeting
- Certificate of completion of an anti-doping education programme. This programme may be provided by a National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) or the WADA elearning programme ALPHA. The certificate should be submitted to World Skate by Team Managers at the Team Managers meeting
- ALPHA is available on the WADA webpage [www.wada-ama.org](http://www.wada-ama.org), click on what we do, education.
- Of the 10 possible anti doping rule violations only 1 depends on a positive test, 5 apply to athletes and 5 apply to athletes and others. You do not need to be tested to attract an anti-doping rule violation (adrv)
